To be eligible:

1. You must be a resident of Covington, KY.
2. You may be no older than 24 years of age as of March 31, 2019.
3. You must have performed voluntary community service.
4. You must be enrolled in or planning to enroll in an accredited two-year to four-year post-secondary educational institution for the 2019 – 2020 school year. Vocational and Technical programs are included.

One winner will be selected from qualified applicants, and the scholarship money will be sent to the accredited educational institution of the winner's choice.

If the scholarship award is not used by March 31, 2020, it will be forfeited.

Completed applications and all required forms must be received by WWNA by March 31, 2019.

*Applications from students who do not meet eligibility criteria will be disqualified.
Scholarship winner will be notified by April 30, 2019.*

2. **ESSAY (Do NOT put your name on the essay)**

Essay Instructions: Write an essay of 500 words or less. Essay may be no longer than two pages.

Your topic is “How I’ve Helped My Community Through Volunteer Service.”

Focus on one particular service project in which you’ve participated, which you feel has made a positive contribution to your community.

INCLUDE IN ESSAY:

How many hours per week did you give to the volunteer work described in your essay?

Estimate the **TOTAL** number of hours you gave to this work.

Approximate date you began this volunteer work and the date you ended this work.

Your essay should be neatly typed, double spaced, and 12-point font. If you do not have a computer, you may use one at your school or public library.

Sincerity, dedication to your volunteer activity, and compliance with Kentucky writing standards will be considered in evaluating essays. You should prepare this essay without assistance, other than a proof reader.

3. **Proof of age and address (such as a copy of a legally accepted document like a driver’s license or a state identification card).**
