

## Extra Curricular and Athletics Policy

Students involved in after-school, extracurricular and athletic activities shall exemplify Glenn O. Swing academic and behavioral expectations and standards. Students are best able to meet expectations and achieve standards when all stakeholders communicate effectively. In order to ensure that all students are held to the same high standard and that participation is consistent between activities, the following guidelines were established. This policy ensures communication between teachers, parents, sponsors, coaches and administrators.

In order to participate in any extracurricular activity, which may include but is not limited to: soccer, basketball, cheerleading, Girl/Boy Scouts, Weekday School of Religion, STLP, Girls on the Run, Art Clubs, or BLOCK, a student must be passing all academic subjects and must have behavior that is conducive to learning.

A student must be passing all reported academic subjects in order to be eligible for participation. If a student has a grade that falls below passing (60% on a 100% grade scale), the following steps will be taken:

1. The teacher shall be responsible for contacting the parent to notify them of a failing grade. The contact shall be recorded in Infinite Campus.
2. The student then has one week (seven calendar days) to improve the grade to passing. The student will be on probation during this time. The student will be allowed to play or participate during this probation period.
3. The classroom teacher can offer tutoring during this time or require an afterschool time to make up any missed assignments; this may take place in lieu of practice or activity.
4. If the student does not bring the grade to passing after one week, the student will be placed on academic suspension. While student is on suspension, they will be required to continue to attend practices or academic tutoring if offered by the teacher but may not participate in practice. Suspended students will be required to attend any games out of uniform. The student will remain on suspension until grade is improved to passing.

A student must also demonstrate model WILDCAT behavior. A student remains behaviorally eligible for participation or play if they have no office referrals in a given week. It is the student's responsibility to conduct themselves in a manner that allows the eligibility for play or participation.

1. If a student is assigned an administrative detention or detained by classroom teacher as a result of classroom behavior on the day of a given activity or athletic practice, the student must serve the detention with administration or classroom teacher prior to the activity or athletic practice. Parent contact as well as notifying the coach, FRC coordinator, or activity sponsor will be the responsibility of the staff member assigning the detention.
